

MBRA “Codes of conduct”

The MBRA is comprised of a group of individuals that enjoy mini buggies, helping others pursue this sport safely and confidently and want to share their knowledge. As a member, you are expected to represent the MBRA in this fashion. We are in this to expand the sport of mini-buggy racing/riding and educate the public on proper driving techniques, a respect for nature & one another and while having fun with our families!

This is the foundation we were built upon and we take this very seriously! Failure to follow the MBRA “Codes of conduct” could be cause for dismissal from the league.

When we ride, there are a few basic rules that we emphasize in our daily running of this league. Family unity and fun should be the theme when building your local chapter. *We are NOT the NHRA!* Below are things we look for in an MBRA representative/member:

- Everyone is welcome, regardless of Race, Age, Religion, Political party, Hair color, etc.!
- MBRA Officials are fair, honest and helpful.
- We share our knowledge whenever we can to anyone who needs it.
- It is important to recruit as many family members as possible. (*A family that plays together after all...*)
- Always, wear a helmet and eye protection! Driving without these is a serious offense regardless of your particular states rules!
- Winning is not everything! It's how you get there that's important!
- Don't ever think that someone getting hurt in one of these buggies while running an event is inevitable! It shouldn't be and we expect better!
- Never allow anyone in your league to attempt a maneuver that they or their buggy are not qualified to perform. (ie. Jumping your truck or the duck pond are bad ideas)
- Directors, Lead by example! You and your staff are the experts and your members look up to you.
- Point out interesting natural occurrences and wildlife you may have in your region.
- Get everyone out of the buggy every once in a while and look at the stars or have some ice cream!
- This has to be fun for everyone! No yelling, screaming or cursing!
- Treat everyone with respect, *even someone who may be breaking the rules.*
- We don't want to be a “Drop off” for people's children. Try to encourage “Family Unity” by ensuring children are accompanied by a parent, sibling or legal guardian whenever possible.
- Take the lead, Start the day off with a safety meeting/inspection or review with all the members each time you ride.
- Hold/take, driver lessons, hill climbing instructions and trail etiquette classes etc regularly. The better informed the consumer is, the safer it is for the sport!
